Unemployment Insurance

Those who have been furloughed or laid-off due to COVID-19 are encouraged to apply for Unemployment Insurance benefits through the Department of Economic Security (DES). On March 20, 2020, Gov. Doug Ducey issued an executive order and administrative action aimed at providing certainty and economic relief for those facing financial hardship because of COVID-19, increasing access to unemployment benefits. These resources are applied retroactively to hardships experienced after March 11, 2020. Applications will be accepted beginning March 23, 2020. DES does n ot have Unemployment Insurance offices. Financial Assistance

Short-Term Crisis Services

STCS provides temporary assistance to low-income families experiencing an emergency need that cannot be met immediately by their own income and resources to help stabilize an immediate financial crisis. A dependent child must live in the home. A crisis is:

1) A separation from the family that resulted from domestic violence where the applicant is unable to return home.

- 2) Loss of income
- 3) An unforeseen event that makes it difficult to meet one's expenses
- 4) A situation that endangers the health and safety of the family
- 5) Applicants must be able to explain and provide proof of emergency need for assistance.

Potential clients enter through the eastern entrance to the building. Individuals seeking service should bring identification (e.g. driver's license, passport, national identification card) and proof of an address within the parish boundaries (Horne on the West, Val Vista on the East, Brown on the North, and Baseline to the South). Proof of an address can be a lease or rental agreement or a utility bill that contains the client's name and address.

Once clients are registered, they may return on a regular basis every two weeks with proof of current address until such time as the need no longer exists.

Renters may qualify for rental payment assistance under the Arizona COVID Relief Program. This program is for Arizona residents only who meet other qualifying criteria.
